



# Elizabethtown-Kitley

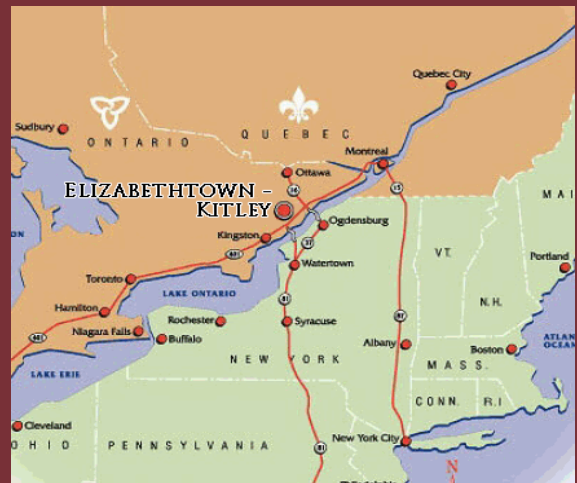

Elizabethtown-Kitley is home to many annual festivals and events that celebrate both the community and its heritage. Much history is represented within the township, including areas such as Butternut Bay overlooking the St Lawrence River, Addison, Toledo, Tincap and Greenbush. Attractions include Bellamy Park and Campground, the Lyn Heritage Museum, and the Lyn Pit Conservation and Mac Johnson Wildlife Areas.
