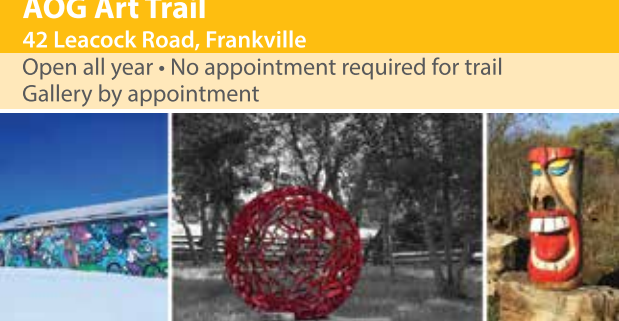

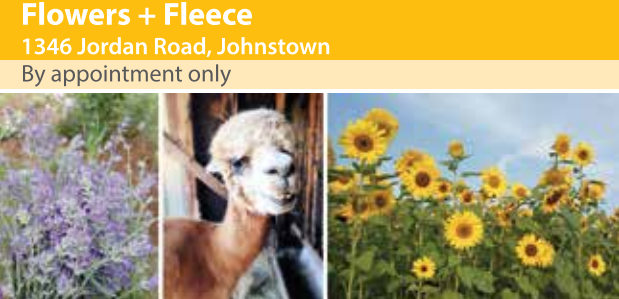

Fulford Place, a 1901 Edwardian mansion features Italianate gardens designed by the renowned Olmsted Brothers landscape architecture firm. The property and garden include a triton fountain, statuary, stone walls and gates that gives a glimpse of its luxurious past. Nearby is Courthouse Square that boasts spring tulips and seasonal flowerbeds set amongst the Fulford Memorial Fountain and situated near three historic churches, a host of Canadian war hero Sir Isaac Brock and the Brockville War Memorial with a panoramic view of the St. Lawrence River. Canada's first railway tunnel is steps away along with dining and shopping.

## Gardens of Gananoque

Situated on the Gananoque River, Confederation Park features a beautiful fountain, and works by Canadian and local artists in one of Canada's largest outdoor contemporary art exhibits. On land donated by the MacDonald family in 1924, the park sits on the site of the town's first post office.

## No. 9 Gardens

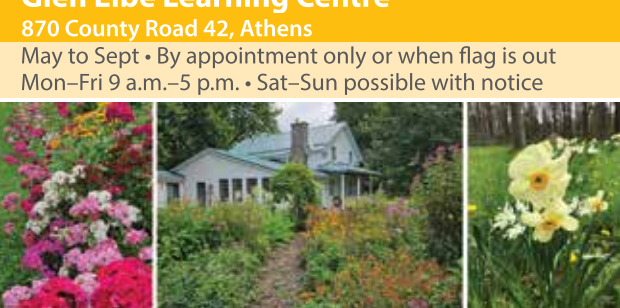

## The Opinicon

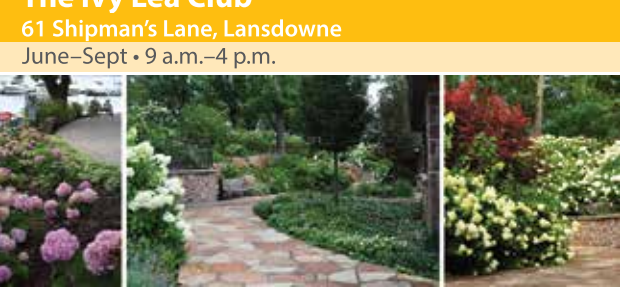

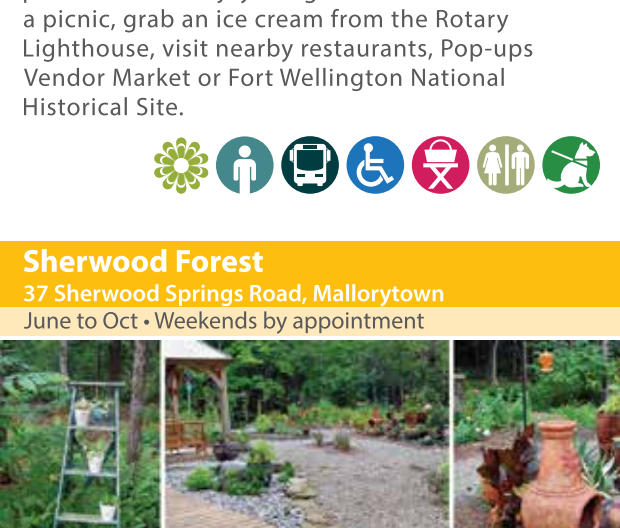
