



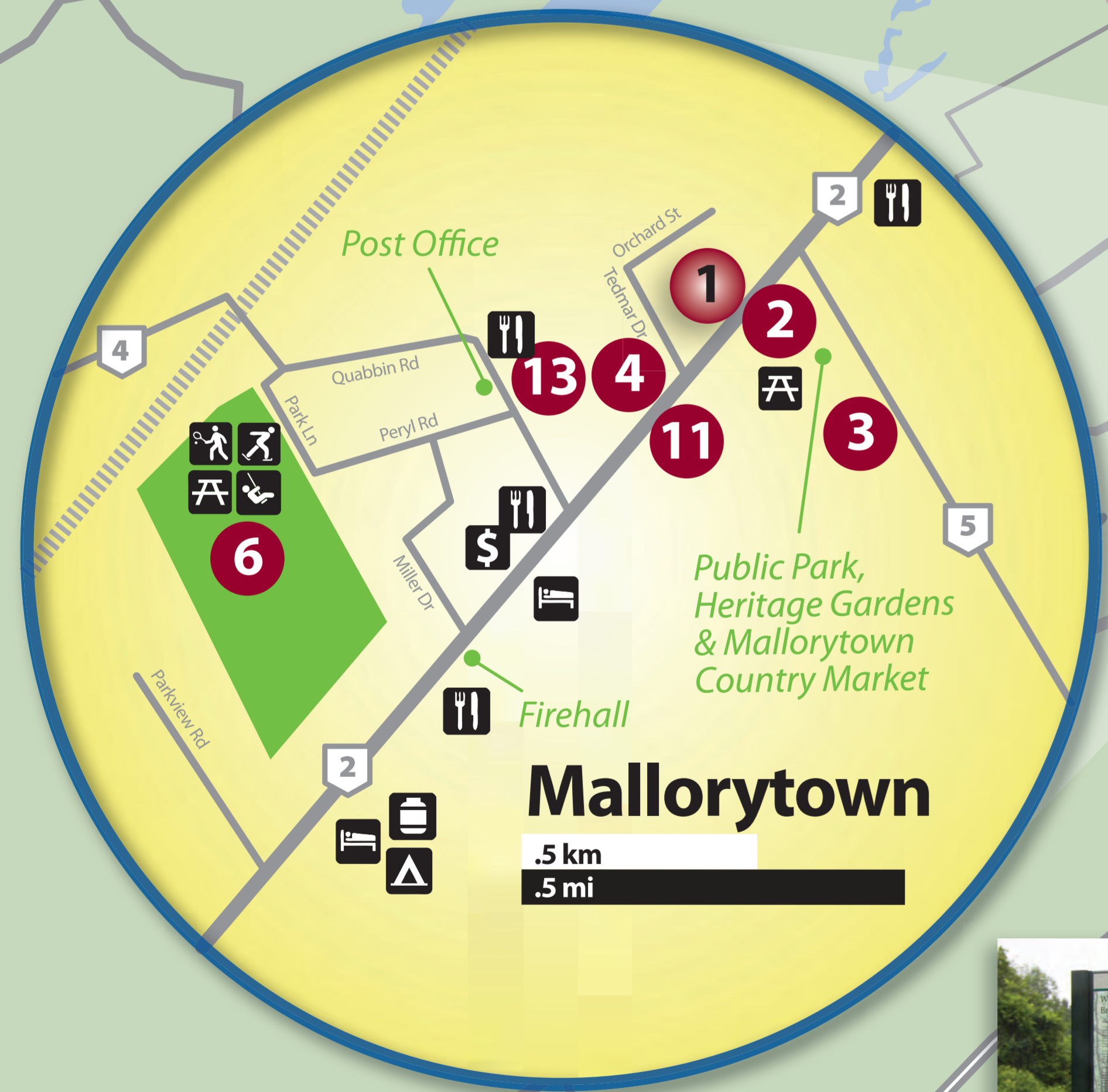
We have plenty of meandering rivers and lakes just waiting for you to explore.

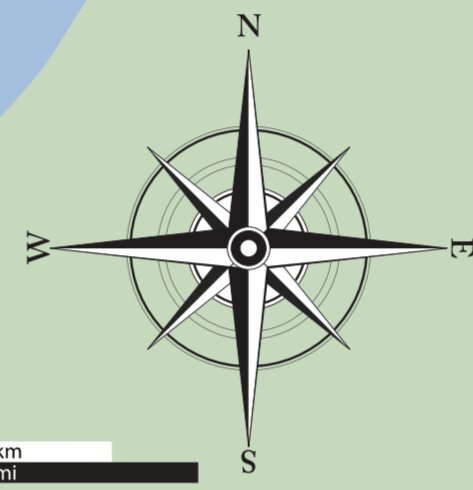

- 1 YOU ARE HERE. Front of Yonge Township Municipal Office.**
- 2 Mallory Coach House**
Built in 1853, site of community events and historic tours.
- 3 Mallorytown Community Centre & Library**
Hosts community events and offers reading spaces and internet services.
- 4 Front of Yonge Elementary School**
An award winning JK to grade 6 school.
- 5 Glass Works**
The site of the first glass works in Canada. See the plaque at the Mallory Coach House for more info.
- 6 Recreation Park**
Come out and enjoy exciting baseball, soccer, tennis and skating.
- 7 1000 Islands National Park Trails**
Get out and enjoy the many trails throughout the area. NOTE: The Jones Creek Trail has two entrances.
- 8 Lookout & Interpretive Centre**
Part of the 1000 Islands National Park program.
- 9 Mallorytown Landing**
Picnic, enjoy trails, launch a boat or watch ships go by.
- 10 Remembrance Road**
Dedicated to the memory of 19 fallen area servicemen.
- 11 Mallorytown United Church**
Mallorytown's beautiful historic church, welcoming to all since 1876.
- 12 St. Paul's Presbyterian Church**
Known for musical programs and community outreach, the little country church with a big heart was built in 1876.
- 13 Royal Canadian Legion Branch 484**
Chartered 1948. Visit the Wall of Honours.
- 14 Browns Bay Provincial Day Use Park**
Great beach with swimming and boat launch. See the ships go by Singer Castle.
- 15 Waterfront Trail**
Paved 40 km bike path makes for an enjoyable day or overnight trip in the very scenic 1000 Islands.

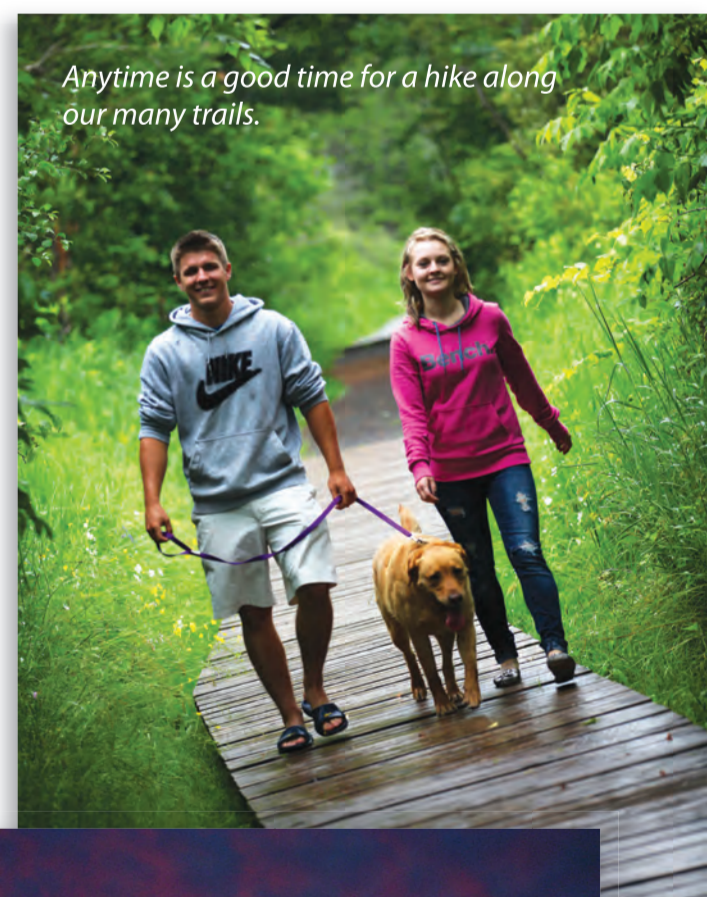

Spend a leisurely weekend watching boats of all sizes pass by.



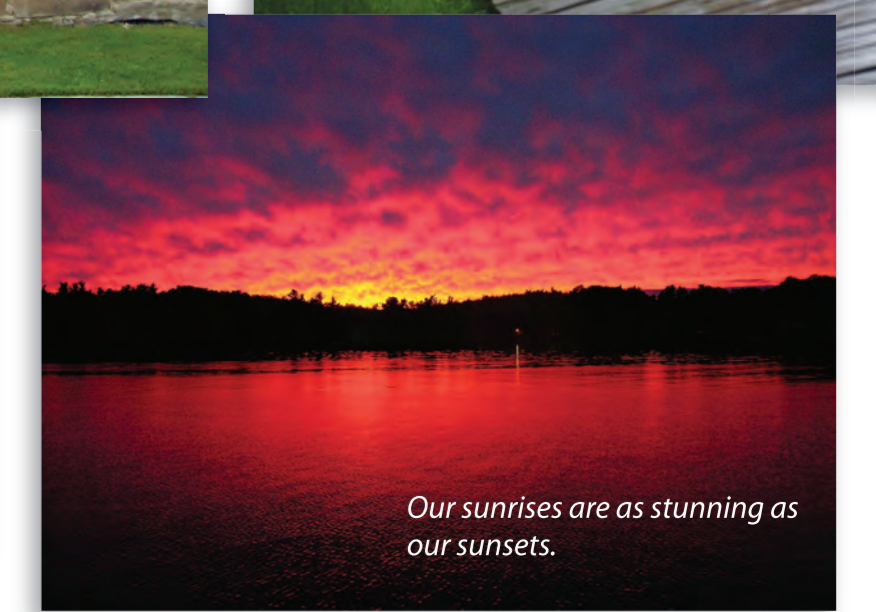
